For this discussion, draw upon any novels that you may have read. (One of the aims of this exercise is to bring into discussion as many texts as possible.)

- 1. In what ways are modern novels similar to ancient novels?
- 2. Do modern novels tell us more or less about contemporary societies than ancient novels?
- 3. Are modern novels more or less 'literary' than ancient novels?
- 4. What, in your view, are the major characteristics of the modern novel?
- 5. What kind of techniques of characterisation have you encountered when reading a modern novel?
- 6. Do you agree with Auerbach's suggestion that the major difference between ancient and modern fiction is the level of realism?
- 7. Think about the major novels of the Romantic period (i.e. the works of Mary Shelley, Walter Scott, Jane Austen, Emily Bronte and Charlotte Bronte): what do they have in common?
- 8. What constitutes a 'historical fiction'?
- 9. What are the characteristics of Modernism in literature?
- 10. What is the future direction of fiction?
