
Modes of Reading Week 3 Frederick Jameson



By the end of the seminar: Is Sam Selvon's *The Lonely Londoners* a postmodern novel, according to Jameson's arguments in "Postmodernism and Consumer Society"?

- 1. Discuss the breakdown between high and mass (or low) culture, as Jameson characterises it.
- 2. What does Jameson argue are the two key features of postmodernism?
- **3.** Define pastiche and parody, what is their relationship to one another (similarities, differences). From Jameson, give an example of each.
- **4.** Can you identify either pastiche or parody in *The Lonely Londoners*? BE SPECIFIC!
- **5.** Does *The Lonely Londoners* demonstrate Jameson's description of the "death of the subject" and "the end of individualism"? If yes, how?
- **6.** "Its peculiar way with time" (548), discuss Jameson's relating postmodernism and schizophrenia.
- 7. How does Selvon's The Lonely Londoners engage time and temporality?
