IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN The Sixth daye of Februarye Anno dmi 1624
And in the Twoe and Twentieth yeere of the reigne of our Sov(er)eigne
Lord Kinge James of this Realme

of England etc I Joane Browne of the boughroughe of new Woodstocke
in the Cowntie of

Oxon widdowe beinge sicke in boddie but in perfecte memorie doe
declare this my laste will and Testament in

manner and forme followinge Firste and principally I doe comende
my soule into the hands of allmightie

God whoe gave it me And my boddie to the Earth to be buryed in
Woodstocke Churche by my husbände hopinge

and assuredly beleevinge that my soule and boddie shall meete
and be ioyned in one in the daye of the Resurreccion

of the iuste and lyve with my Saviour and Redeem(er) Jesus Christe
in everlastinge ioye and happines And as

for my wordly goodes I geve and bequeath them in manner and forme
followinge (That is to saye) Item I geve unto

the Churche of the Towne of Woodstocke aforesaid Twentie shillinges
And to the preacher that shall preache

my funerall Sermon Tenn shillinges And unto the poore people

putt out to the best proffite and advantage for the use and benifit of the same Mary Marriatt untill she shalbe married

or shall accomlishe the full age of one and twentie yeeres (And to nowe other intent or purpose whatsoev(er)) And if she

shall dye before she shalbe married or shall accomlishe the said full age of one and twentie yeeres Then my will

is And I doe freely geve the same monyes (and the proffithereof to be made) to the Children of my said dawghter

Joane Marriatt which she shall have by the said John Marriatt her nowe husband equally to be devided
