The forum will include short talks from invited speakers working in secondary and higher education, and following the talks there will be a number of workshop events.

Confirmed speakers include: Judith Affleck (Head of Classics, King Edward VI School, Stratford-upon-Avon), Peter Brown (Classics, Trinity College, Oxford), Gesine Manuwald (Professor of Latin, Department of Greek and Latin, University College London), and Helen Slaney (Junior Research Fellow, Classics, St Hilda's College, Oxford).

SCHOOLS TALK:

The forum will be followed by a talk for 16-19 year-olds entitled 'Roman Drama in Renaissance England', given by Sarah Knight (Senior Lecturer in Renaissance Literature, School of English, University of Leicester). The schools event will last from 3-5 p.m. During that time, there will be the opportunity for teachers attending the pedagogical forum to visit the Archive of Performances of Greek and Roman Drama (also based in the Classics faculty) and a Latin drama-related exhibition across the road at St John's College.
