I have to inform you that the above-named gave three short concerts in this borough on the 6th May, 1949.

He came to the town at the request of Mr. Konni Zilliacus, M.P., and the arrangements for the concerts were undertaken by Councillor G.C. Esther, who is the Chairman of the Gateshead Labour Farty and Trades Council and also the chief nominator of the candidature of Mr. Zilliacus as Gateshead Parliamentary Candidate for the next General Election much against the wishes of the National Executive of the Party.

One of the concerts were held in the Bensham Cinema, Gateshead, before an audience of approximately 850, and another at the Town Hall, Bateshead, before an audience of 700. He also attended an Evening Bervice at St. John's Church, Sheriff Hill, Gateshead, where he sang to a congregation of approximately 600.

He was accompanied at each concert by Mr. Zilliacus and Councillor Sother and although the concerts were billed as non-political, references were made during the concerts by both Zilliacus and Esther, and the singer himself to the fact that Robeson was in future only going to sing to the working-class people and devote the rest of his life in ass ting them in their struggles for better conditions etc.

Robeson only sung one American Revoluntionary type of song by the title of "Joe Hill", but it was noticed that during his rendering of the song "Old Man River" he changed the words "you get a little drunk and you lands in gaol" to "you show a little grit and you lands in gaol"; also the words "tired of living and feared of dying" to "tired of .iving but we go on fighting".

The National Anthem was played at the concert held in the Cown Hall.

I enclose copies of the printed invitation cards. The cards for the public concerts were issued through the various union officials and forks Committees.

The meetings were very orderly, and Robeson was well received.
