 A Public Meeting will be held at Ealing Town Hall, on Monday. 28th February, 1949, at 8 p.m. Speakers will include Lady Parmoor, Henry Usborne, M.P., and Dr. E. H. S. Burhop, Council Member of Atomic Scientists Assn., Lecturer at University College, London, and Rev. Railton Bax will be in the chair.

 A follow-up campaign of further meetings, letters to the Press and to prominent persons, and other forms of publicity, will be undertaken with the object of arousing further interest.
