It may also interest you to know that the suggestion has been put forward that Paul RONESON, chairman of the Communist controlled Council in African Affairs, should be invited to open the Pausafrican Frade Union Conference; the sponsors estimate that the U.S. Jovernment will refuse him permission to leave the country and that this could then be used for propaganda amongst the African masses.

We learn from source CHEST that remand BUCKLE, British Communist Party efficial and permanent member of their African committee, has suggested that Paul ROBESON might be invited to open the Pan-African Trade Union Conference which is due to take place this month in Duals in the French Comercons.

In miking this suggestion HURLE did not enticipate ROBESON being allowed to make the necessary journey (your PP-143 of 4 request, 1950, refers), but considered that a first-class propagends issue could be made out of the refusal.

The holding of the Pan-African Trade Union Conference is an attempt by the W.F.T.U. to draw together the leaders of the African Trade Unions with a view to setting up an African Lisison Bureau on the lines of the Asian and Australesian one in Paking.

We have chosen to give you this information in this form as the proposal to send ROHESON is only tentative and the holding of the conference seems to be liable to postponement due to lack of support. As far as is known ROBESON himself has not been approached.

Lastly, I am putting forward the suggestion - if, indeed, it has not been made already - that Paul ROBESON be invited to open the Pan-African T.U.Conference. If the U.S.Government refuses him permission to leave the country to attend the conference, as they will almost certainly do, then we shall have a first class issue for propaganda for arousing the African working masses.

## ROBESON DEMANDS IS PASSPORT

WASHINGTON, Wednesday.

TOAUL ROBESON has asked the Federal District Court here to order the State Department to stop preventing him from going abroad.

Mr. Robeson, who told the World Peace Committee in Paris last American Negroes April that would never go to war against Russia, informed the court vesterday that the Department cancelled

his passport last July. He asked that the Department be ordered to revoke the cancellation and cease any acts which would prevent his leaving the United States.

Mr. Robeson said he had derived

years from singing and acting in this country and Europe. To prevent him from making a

projected concert and speaking tour abroad, he added, was to deprive him of a property right guaranteed by the Constitution. Mr. Robeson was prevented by the cancellation of his passport

from attending the Second World Peace Congress in Warsaw. Congress elected him on to the World Peace Council. A leader of the beace movement in the United States, he is also a leader of the Negro peoples and is

President of the Council on African Affairs-an organization which the U.S. Attorney-General has his entire income for more than 25. listed as "subversive."-Reuter.
