#### A challenging time for primary care



- > 90% contacts with NHS take place in primary care
- < 10% NHS budget spent on primary care</li>
- Substantial increasing demand and expectations
- Ageing population, growing numbers of patients with long term conditions
- Squeezed budgets over-stretched primary care, community and social care resources
- Difficult workforce issues

What is the best possible care that can be provided to patients and families, close to where they live and work, within the limits of available resources?

- Organisation and delivery of care

- Health promotion, disease prevention
- Patient experience and outcomes
- Use and effectiveness of technologies and treatments
