Library Search

- Library Search is the library's search engine or discovery service
- Find books/chapters, journals/articles, databases and more
- Access library account: view and renew items on-loan
- Recall & reserve on-loan items and request click & collect

Print books



- Library Search will tell you the copies, location, classmark and availability
- The classmark is the subject classification and place on library shelves
- You can borrow an almost unlimited number of books (999 items)
- The standard loan period is 1 year (except 3 day loan books)
- If a book is recalled, it must be returned early (1 week)
- If all copies are on-loan, you can recall the book using Click & Collect

Ebooks

- The library has 1.3+ million ebooks from many publishers and platforms
- Library Search will connect you to ebooks click on Full Text Online
- Login with your university IT number and password

Restrictions on the use of library ebooks (licensing and copyright):

- Copies: single user, multiple user or unlimited users
- Printing: 10% pages, 1 chapter in book or unlimited printing
- Download: read online only, download PDFs, download to e-reader

Ejournals

- The library has 1.5+ thousand ejournals from many publishers and platforms
- There are 3 ways to find ejournals using **Library Search**:
 - 1. Article: search by author and article title
 - 2. Journal: search by journal title then browse by year/volume/issue
 - 3. Subject: search by keywords then limit results to 'journal article'
- Quick Look: shows you the article details, keywords and abstract
- Click on Full Text Online to access the article/journal
- Login with your university IT number and password

Google

- **Library Search** is the best way to access books, journals and databases
- If you research with Google, you may be denied access to full-text (paywall)
- Look for options to Login via Institution and search for Warwick
- You should be prompted to login with your IT username and password
- Google Scholar can be personalised to link to the university library
- Click on the Menu > Settings > Library Links and search for Warwick
- Warwick Access will then appear in Google Scholar search results

Document supply

- Get It For Me is the library's document supply service
- Access to books, chapters and articles not available in the library:
 - Digitisation: of articles and chapters from another library
 - Inter-Library Loan: borrow a book from another library
 - Book Suggestion: request purchase of books for our library
- You can also request postal loan of print books held in our library

Databases

- The library has many specialist research databases for economists
- Find academic journals + working papers, news, country/industry reports
 - ABI/INFORM Global: business, economics, finance & management
 - Business Source Ultimate: business, finance & management
 - EconLit: economics and finance
 - Scopus: multidisciplinary inc social sciences & economics
 - Web of Science: multidisciplinary inc social sciences & economics

Finding information on a topic

Search strategy

- 1. Identify your keywords
- 2. Develop your search terms
- 3. Select a search engine
- 4. Enter your search terms
- 5. Evaluate and refine your results
- 6. Select your information sources

Search terms and connectors

- "Phrase Search": find two or more words together
 - "minimum wage"
- Truncation*: find different word endings
 - econom* finds economy, economic, economist, econometrics
- AND: find both or all search terms (narrow search)
 - "minimum wage" AND poverty
- OR: find one of many search terms (widen search)
 - ("minimum wage" OR NMW) AND (poverty OR poor)
- NOT: exclude results containing a specific search term
 - "minimum wage" NOT "living wage"

Current awareness

- Keep up-to-date with new publications in your research field
- Register for email alerts with a journal or database
- Databases: register with database for alerts to new articles on a topic
 - e.g. Business Source, EconLit, Scopus and Web of Science
- Google Scholar: create a simple alert for new publications on a topic
- Working Papers: early versions of academic journal articles
- Journal: register directly with the journal/publisher for new issue alerts
- JournalTOCs: collection of scholarly journals table of contents



- The library has many sources of macro & micro economic data:
 - ONS: Office for National Statistics (official statistics for the UK)
 - UKDS: UK Data Service (research data repository)
 - EuroStat: official statistics about EU members
 - OECD: official data and publications from OECD members
 - IMF: global data and reports from the IMF
 - World Bank: global data from the World Bank



UK Data Service

- UK's national repository of economic, social and population data
- Includes macro and micro data from ONS, IMF, OECD and World Bank
- Access: register with @warwick.ac.uk email & login to download data
- Also offers an excellent range of training courses and webinars

Company, industry & financial data

- The library has many company, industry and financial databases:
 - Fame: company information for the UK Ireland
 - Orbis & Orbis Bank Focus: global company and banking information
 - Capital IQ: global company and financial markets information
 - Refinitiv Eikon: global company and financial markets information
 - Gale Business Insights: global company and industry information
 - IBIS World: industry, market research and risk ratings reports
 - Global Financial Data: global economic and financial time-series data



Refinitiv Eikon

- Key international company, industry and financial database
 - includes Environment, Social and Governance (ESG) data
- Only available in the library. Book Refinitiv Eikon terminal online!
- Eikon training and certification available via Refinitiv Learning Centre



Research support

The library has a **Research and Academic Services** team to support researchers:

- Disseminating your research and getting published
- OA: open access publishing and funding (OA journals and books)
- WRAP: deposit your research in the Warwick Research Archive Portal
- RDM: research data management plan, store, preserve & share your data
- Bibliometrics: using citations to measure authors, articles and journals
