

### Responsibilities

#### Immigration Responsibilities - Yours and Ours (warwick.ac.uk)

- Immigration documents
- Keep contact details up to date with University AND UKVI
- Take responsibility for your own learning, whilst meeting the University progression and engagement requirements
- Seek help if you are struggling in any way
- Deferring, suspending, withdrawing
- Do not breach the conditions of your visa

### Engagement with your studies

- You must refer to your course handbook for important information about engaging with your studies.
- Visa sponsored students will be withdrawn from their studies if they do not meet the UKVI requirements for engagement with studies.
- Following each missed contact point, you will be contacted by your department.
- Failure to respond following 3 or more missed points will result in withdrawal of visa sponsorship

### Working

You can work while in the UK on a Student Visa, however the conditions of your leave stipulate that you must not:

- ➢ Fill a full-time permanent vacancy
- > Work more than the number of hours permitted
- Be self-employed or engaged in a business activity
- Be employed as a doctor or dentist in training (unless on a recognised Foundation Programme)
- Be employed as a professional sportsperson or entertainer

### Working – how many hours?

- For Masters Students:
  - > 20 hours throughout their course duration.
  - Course duration = CAS Course Start Date to CAS Course end date
- 20 hours limit ends on your CAS course end date, or earlier if you have requested a specific letter and it is:

1) No more than 4 weeks before the CAS course end date

and

2) Your official dissertation submission deadline has passed

and

3) You have submitted all work

As Economics MSc Students, you <u>cannot</u> undertake a fulltime work placement during your course.

### The Graduate Route – what is it?

<u>Warwick - Immigration - Student -</u> <u>Graduate Route Work Visa</u>

- Unsponsored post study work visa
- ➤2 year grant of leave
- Does NOT lead to settlement
- Does NOT permit study
- ➤Can only apply once



### The Graduate Route – eligibility criteria


Applicants to the Graduate Route must:

- Be awarded the qualification stated on their CAS
- ➤Apply before their Student Visa expires
- ≻Apply from inside the UK
- Have spent an appropriate amount of time studying in the UK
- Have held a Student visa for 12 months or more

### Travelling

You must always get permission from your Academic Department before travelling during your course dates

#### Travelling within Europe (warwick.ac.uk)

- You may need a Schengen visa to travel in Europe
- Check requirements at the country Embassy
- Travel safe!
- Be aware of what to do if your BRP gets lost or stolen
