Ground Transportation to/from airport:

Should you need transportation from San Francisco International Airport (SFO) or San Jose Airport (SJC), here are some choices:

- Super Shuttle is also available and can be contacted at (650) 558-8500.
- Uber is available to/from San Francisco for \$80, (or \$60 with UberX), and San Jose for \$75.
- 101 Limo and Young's Limo are useful car services, and charge about \$85/\$95 each way, respectively. 101 Limo can be contacted for reservations at 1-877-475-5466 and Young's Limo can be contacted at 415-452-9800.
- We do not recommend taking a taxi because you will be charged 150 percent of the metered rate for distances of 15 miles or farther outside the city limits.

Parking is enforced M-F between 8am-4pm. Visitors have several parking and payment options:

- \$1.50/hour **coin-metered spaces** (2 hour limit) located on Serra St. in front of Encina Hall and Burnham Pavilion; and along Galvez St.
- **One-day Visitor "scratcher" permits** (which allow parking in Visitor Pay Parking lots and at meters), available for \$12 each at the Parking and Transportation office located at 340 Bonair Siding; accessible via Campus Dr. and open weekdays 7:30 a.m. - 5 p.m. One-day "scratcher" permits must

be prominently displayed (hung from the rear view mirror) with the date of use properly scratched off.

- **Parking permit/ pay and display machines**

You may purchase up to 8 hours of parking at any machine (\$12.00 maximum/day). The machines accept Visa or MasterCard, bills, or coins; if you do not use your credit card, please bring cash in smaller denominations because these machines do not issue change.

- **Pay & Display permit dispenser locations near the Hoover Institution**

- Visitor Center / Track House (L-95)
- Memorial Way (near Memorial Auditorium); accessible via Galvez St.

The Visitor parking permit should be placed on the car dashboard with the expiration time and date facing up. A valid Pay & Display parking permit (properly displayed) may be used to park in any Visitor Pay & Display parking location, and at parking meters, but are NOT valid in Pay By Space # locations elsewhere on campus.

- **Parkmobile**

- P&TS has teamed up with Parkmobile to make paying for visitor parking on campus easier. Visitors can now use the Parkmobile app or mobile website to pay using a credit card (Visa, MasterCard, Discover, and American Express) at metered, pay-and-display and pay-by-space parking locations. In addition to the visitor parking fee, Parkmobile charges 35 cents for each transaction.
- Using Parkmobile, you can opt to receive a mobile phone notification 15 minutes before your parking session is set to expire. If you haven't exceeded the maximum time limit of the space where you are parked, you have the option to extend your parking through the app or by calling 877.727.5718. The toll-free number is posted on the meter or pay machine.
- Not all visitor spaces are equipped to accept Parkmobile payments, so look for the green Parkmobile sticker posted on the parking meter or pay machine.

Additional Transportation: Biking is a common form of transportation around campus and the local area. Bikes can be rented from the [Campus Bike Shop](#).

To Do Around Town

Off Campus:

Sharon Park Shopping: A short walk from the Stanford Guest House, the shopping center offers a Safeway grocery store, CVS pharmacy, and various food and shopping options.

Town and Country shopping center: Offers a variety of restaurants, coffee shops/bakeries, dessert and grocery options, as well as retail stores. For a detailed list of options, go to www.tandcvillage.com. Town and Country is located at 855 El Camino Real (at Embarcadero) across from Palo Alto High School. It is a moderate walking distance from campus, or you can take the marguerite shuttle (line X) if you do not have a car.

Downtown Palo Alto: Downtown has a variety of restaurants, coffee shops, dessert and bars as well as a variety of retail stores. For a detailed list, go to www.paloaltdowntown.com. Downtown Palo Alto is

located on University Ave, and is accessible to the train station. If you do not have transportation, the Marguerite shuttle (“SLAC”, by way of “SE” or “X” shuttle) provides service to the Palo Alto train station.

Stanford Shopping Center (<http://www.simon.com/mall/stanford-shopping-center>): Includes many major department stores including Nordstrom, Macys and Neiman Marcus as well as a variety of retail stores. Also included are restaurants, coffee shops and bakeries. Stanford Shopping center is located at 660 Stanford Shopping Center, Palo Alto, CA. It is accessible from the Train Station as well as the Marguerite Shuttle.
