- 1. What is the main question you are addressing?
- 2. Why is it relevant? (Find facts why should be interested in it, evidence, media debate, policy implication etc...)
- 3. What does the existing theory say? (literature review)
- 4. What is your contribution to the literature? (what it is new compared to the existing literature –it can be a new dataset, inclusion of some missing explanatory variable etc..)
- 5. What is your estimation strategy (assuming you are doing an empirical work) and which are your predictions. (what is the dependent variable, what are the main explanatory variables etc)
- 6. Your dataset: list in details you main variables and their source. (Important, make sure you are able to get them!!!)
