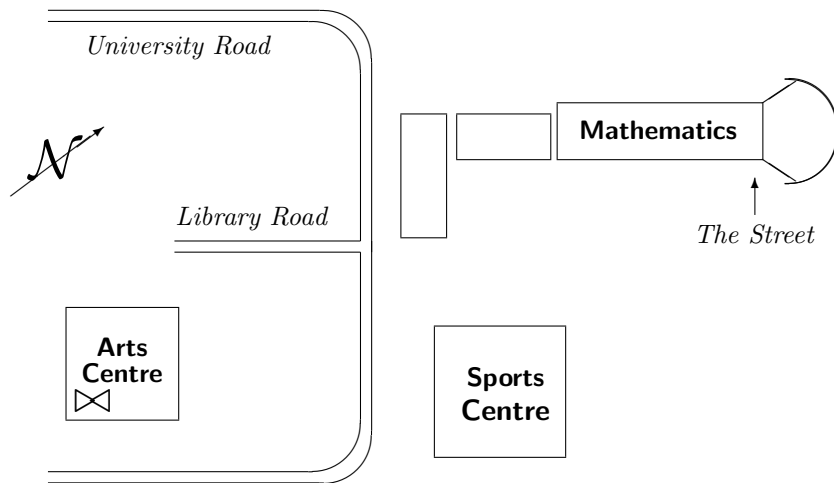

Locations of Meeting Rooms

The Street is the local name for the atrium of the new Mathematics Building. MS01 is on the ground (that is, 0th) floor, and MS04 and MS05 are on the 2nd floor. There are two lifts.

The University Bookshop (⊠) is below the Mead Gallery, on the southern corner of the ground floor of the Arts Centre complex. This is easily identified by the theatre fly-tower.

Playwrights Restaurant (⊗) is at 4-6 Hay Lane, a short street in the centre of Coventry between the Cathedral Precinct and the mock-Tudor Council House. The spire of the old St Michael's Cathedral, and the smaller spire of Holy Trinity nearby, are prominent landmarks.
