

As you travel through the space, start by considering whose art and whose stories are remembered with Modern Tribal; unravel what it means to seek justice in a context of conflict with Memory and (In)Justice; deliberate on who has the right to decide what is offensive with Whose Satire is it Anyway?; have a taste of what those decisions about justice feel like from inside prison with The Production of Mental Distress in Prison; and put yourself in the place of former prisoners with Expressions of Punishment.

By the end, will you think about truth, justice and history differently?

1 WELCOME

Welcome to The Production of Truth, Justice and History. Get your questions ready and be ready to question yourself and those you encounter. Who gets to decide what is true, what is just, or what is the definitive version of history?

2 SOUTHWARK ROOM

Join us in the Southwark Room for free events throughout the week including film, theatre, dance and discussion. Events are free but ticketed; reserve your place through warwicktate.eventbrite.com or drop in if there are still spaces on the day.

3 MODERN TRIBAL: PRODUCING INDIGENEITY IN OUR TIMES

Watch The Tale of the Tribes, a 35-minute series of five short animated films that are adaptations of indigenous folktales from India. They have been made in collaboration with indigenous artists and digital media artists. The stories are from the Pardhan Gonds in Madhya Pradesh, the Angami in Nagaland, the Meitei in Manipur, the Tani group in Arunachal Pradesh and the Lepcha in Sikkim. Local art forms and designs have been incorporated into the visual design of the films. The production, by the Adivasi Arts Trust, has been mastered into 7

languages, including five local languages spoken by the communities represented in the films.

4 MODERN TRIBAL: PRODUCING INDIGENEITY IN OUR TIMES

Experience Gond Art, with pop-up Bana music performances throughout the day. Gond has recently emerged as a form of painting and visual representation that is practised by artists from the Gond community in central India. Award-winning contemporary Gond artists Narayan Deen, Rajendra Shyam, Venkat Raman Singh Shyam will be present to talk to visitors about the paintings on display and their own artistic practices.

5 MEMORY AND (IN) JUSTICE: CULTURES OF RESISTANCE IN #KASHMIR

Mnemosyne's Karkhane is a multi-sensory space where artist Uzma Falak and researcher Goldie Osuri work with the threads of memory and freedom. Through interactions and conversations, this space will be a window into cultures of resistance in #Kashmir.

Mnemosyne - proper noun: the Greek goddess of memory. *Karkhane* - noun in Koshur, Kashmir's native language: refers to an artisan's workroom.

6 MEMORY AND (IN) JUSTICE: CULTURES OF RESISTANCE IN #KASHMIR

Watch excepts from Uzma Falak's film *Till Then the Roads Carry Her* about memory and resistance among women in Kashmir, and explore with Goldie Osuri how Twitter works alongside more traditional media as way for voices from the conflict zone of Kashmir to be heard.

7 WHOSE SATIRE IS IT ANYWAY?

Listen to audio re-enactments from the 1817 trial of satirist William Hone, accused of blasphemous libel against the royal family and the government. You're invited to be the jury and reach a verdict as to whether or not Hone should be acquitted.

8 THE PRODUCTION OF MENTAL DISTRESS IN PRISON

Be absorbed in soundscapes exploring women's experiences in prison in this sound installation produced by Fuel. Created by artists Rachel Mars, Paula Varjack and Sabrina Mahfouz in collaboration with sound designer Gareth Fry, in response to research by Hilary Marland and Rachel Bennett.

9 THE PRODUCTION OF MENTAL DISTRESS IN PRISON

See a photographic record of Past Time, an education programme exploring the history of food through drama and cookery with men in prison.

10 EXPRESSIONS OF PUNISHMENT: EMOTIONS, IDENTITIES AND LIVED EXPERIENCES IN ENGLISH PRISONS

Play a table top game, Probationary: The Game of Life on Licence, that illustrates the challenges of navigating the probation process. On Wednesday, book a place at the Human Library to talk with former prisoners or take part in an interactive theatrical exercise about the future of the criminal justice system in the UK.
