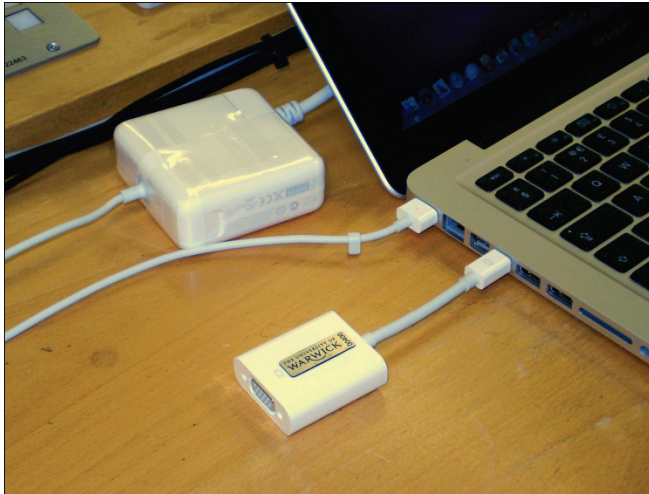


Connecting an Apple Mac laptop to a data projector or plasma display

Audio Visual Services have several adaptors available for recent Apple Mac laptops to allow them to be connected to the AV systems in Centrally Timetabled Teaching Rooms.

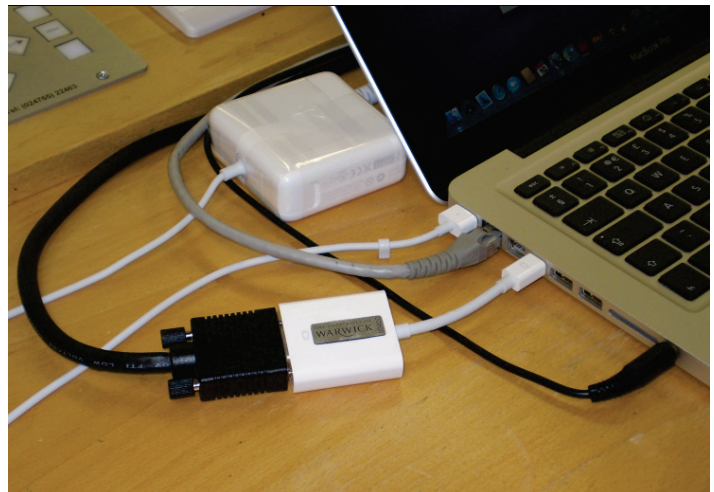
Connect the correct adaptor to the display connection on your laptop.

Tip: ensure the mains adaptor is connected as using an external display will significantly reduce the time your laptop will run on battery.

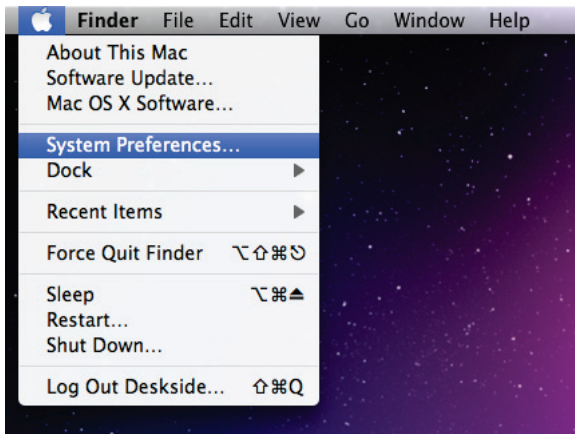
Connect the required cables to your laptop. The VGA connector plugs into the adaptor.

If you require network access, the network cable plugs into the relevant port on your laptop.

If you require sound, the jack connector plugs into the headphone socket on your laptop. Ensure the laptop's volume is turned up.

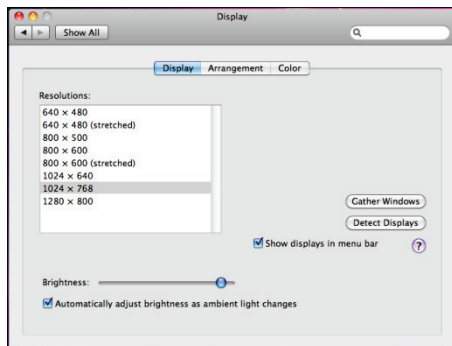


Make sure the projector/plasma screen is switched on and the “PC & Laptop” or “Laptop” input is selected before continuing!

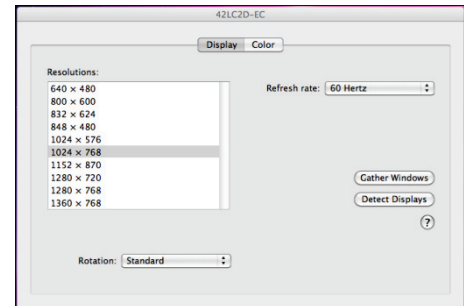


On the desktop, go to the Apple menu and select “System Preferences...”.

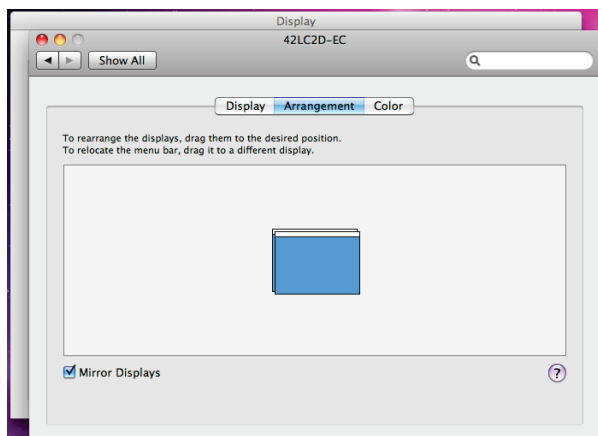
In System Preferences, open the “Displays” control panel item within the “Hardware” section.



A window will appear on each screen showing the current display settings (you may need to click “detect displays” for this to work).



Tip: if you tick the “Show displays in menu bar” box, the displays icon will appear there and allow quicker access in future.



Click the “Arrangement” tab and then tick “Mirror Displays” – this will cause the desktop to be shown on both screens.

You will now be able to show your presentation or document on both the laptop display and projection/plasma screen at the same time.
