

## 1. Network Setup

The network installed into the residences at Warwick is an Ethernet switched LAN operating at 10Mb and 100Mb. To connect to it, you will need a computer and an Ethernet network card. The majority of newer Apple Mac's will have built-in Ethernet cards but it is advisable to check before hand.

The following instructions should guide you through configuration of your Mac O/S 10



Select the **System Preferences** button on the dock or go to the Apple Menu icon, **System Preferences** as shown below.

## 2. How to check Internet Explorer settings
